No legal requirement to stay in Lithuania all year long. Most activities which need your attention can be carried out online

LITHUANIA | Residence on basis of self-employment

For you to receive residence, the following conditions should be met:



You employ yourself and pay monthly taxes of 500 EUR and salary of 700 EUR



You pay annual company fees of around 2500 EUR (office, accounting, taxes)



Your spouse can get join you in two years as a spouse or she should be self-employed as well

LITHUANIA | Residence application process and timing

★ We prepare the business case and full set of documents. You prepare the police clearance certificate, make an appointment with the closest embassy of Lithuania

★ You come to Lithuania for settlement. You obtain your residence permit at Migration office in Vilnius



★ The process is started once the contract has been signed and we have received the prepayment and your CV

★ You receive visa D allowing you to enter Lithuania

★ You start your official contract with the company and register with local social fund and a medical company.

LITHUANIA | Fees and costs

First Residence permit



Prepayment necessary to start – **2995**



Government fees at your application submission – **200 EUR**



Final payment to us – **5000 EUR** after your visa is approved



15% discount to our fees | if first payment made within 2 weeks from today

Total minimum cost for the first Residence permit – 7000 EUR

Next Residence permit

Taxes to pay per year – approx. **5 000 – 6 000 EUR**



Company costs per year – approx. **2 500 EUR**



Government fees to renew residence permit after first 2 years – **100 EUR**. Validity of new permit – 2 years



You also have to pay your living expenses, accommodation



Our renewal fees are 2000 EUR (optional)



Total minimum annual fees – 8 500 EUR

01

Send to a@euresidence.me:

- ★ your CV/Resume + diploma copy
- ★ scanned copy of your travel passport

- ★ your legal address (where you live now) and your Residence permit copy if you live outside of your home country

Once you have signed the contract and paid the first provision (2995 EUR) we will start processing your case. You will need to obtain: Police clearance for the last five years, your diploma.



03

We will contact you once all the documents are ready for you submit them to the embassy in the country where you normally live. The rest of our company's fees is due when your Professional card is approved

LITHUANIA | Frequent questions (1/2)

1. Where do I apply for a Residence permit?

– You always apply via the embassy in the country where you live. If you already have a valid residence in another Schengen country you can apply in that country

2. As the holder of the residence permit, am I obliged to stay in the country all the time?

-No, you can travel. You must only make sure that you maintain your residence address and that you do receive post. Your number of days in the country is not verified by the stamps in your passport.

3. Will a possible refusal affect future entries into the Schengen Area / EEC?

– No. A future refusal is possible only if you were listed into the offenders system of Schengen countries for visa problems or similar.

LITHUANIA | Frequent questions (2/2)

4. What is the difference between a residence permit and permanent residence and between permanent residence and naturalization / a passport?

- Residence permit is a temporary residence permit; it is to be extended on the basis of an operating company and a professional card.
- Permanent residence is a permanent residence permit (unconditional, tied neither to a company, nor to a work).
- Passport gives the full set of capabilities of a citizen.

5. What opportunities does a residence permit give?

- You have the right to medical care, pension, education of children in schools, entry into the Schengen Area and the right to live in the country.
